#### RICH NOMINATED.

THE ELBA FARMER-POLI-TICIAN THE MAN.

He Gets There on the First Ballot, Doubling Pingree's Vote.

SAGINAW, July 21.—The Republican State Convention met shortly after nine o'clock this morning.

The report of the committee on platform was presented and adopted. It condemns the Democratic party in general and particular and presents the Republican party as worthy of special confidence.

Judge Moore, of Lapeer, nominated John T. Rich, of Elba; and J. B. Corless, of Wayne, eloquently presented the name of Mayor H. G. Pingree, of Detroit.

A call of counties was then made by the secretary. The informal ballot resulted: Rich, 5.791; Pingree, Mol; ODonnell, 5; Washington Gardner, 1. The total number of votes cast, 786, necessary to a choice 399. On motion Rich's nomination was made unanimous. After a recess the remainder of the ticket was nominated which will be given next week.

SENATOR Mills has gone to Texas to take the stump against the third party movements which, in the absence of serious opposition, has been making considerable progress in the State.

No Republican editor can point to a laborer whose wages have been increased by the McKinley bill. And yet the tariff is levied solely to "protect American labor." Who can be solblind as to believe it a benefit, when no benefit can be seen?

Upon being shown that more money would be needed during the current fiscal year than had been appropriated by the House, the House conferees agreed to Senate amendments to the Pension Appropriation bill increasing the total amount carried by the bill nearly \$12,000.000. The bill as it now stands appropriates \$146,737,350.




