So long as Mr. Cleveland and his cabinet make continued progress towards a better state of things, even though that progress be slow, as it must in the nature of things be, they should not be hampered by impatient criticism.

In Judge Simpson the old soldiers, the men who faced death and suffered privations of the severest kind in their country's defense during the war of the rebellion, have a man whom they can warmly support at the coming election. He put in four years at the front, the best years of his life, and is a comrade of whom they may well be proud. As a citizen, soldier, lawyer and Judge, he has never shirked his duty but has always been found in the front rank.

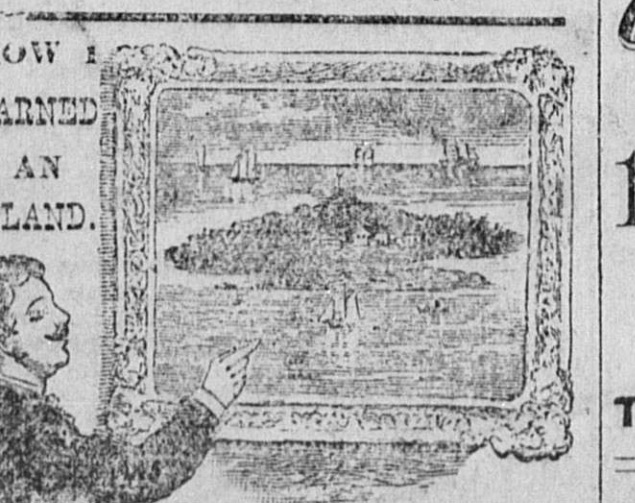

What the republican party needs just now is a hoop-skirt, and it should be big enough to hide its feet as well as its figure.

NEWSPAPER articles booming the Nicaragua canal have become a rarity. Has the adjournment of Congress anything to do with this.

PRESIDENT Cleveland's inaugural address furnished proof positive that there is to be no let up in the democratic war upon the republican god, protection.

ABOUT \$1,000,000 is involved in the suit of the letter-carriers of the country, now before the Supreme Court, for pay for over time since the eight hour law went into effect.

We are under the impression that democratic votes elected the President and a majority of Congress, last November. Why, then, shouldn't the democrats now desire to hold the offices?

ENGLAND has spent in renewing old and in building new churches more than \$100,000,000 in the last twenty years, and still the world at large does not regard England as an exceptionally good country.

THE Alcona County Review takes the most sensible view of the coming judicial contest of any paper in the district. In commenting on the placing of Alcona in the 26th judicial circuit it takes the ground that partisanship should not be considered in the matter; nor neither should it in the judicial election. It says: "But there are questions before us that effect every freeholder, and if a judge in passing judgement upon such questions manifests a disposition to guard and protect the interests of the people, the masses, so far as lies in his power, then he has done his duty. We contend for the principle that the question of partisanship is of less consequence at the polls than to the people of Alcona than that of taxation and the character of the probity, wisdom, and general fitness of the candidates. It matters little to Alcona county whether it is placed in one district or another, so long as its interests are faithfully served by the occupant of the bench. Thousands, yes, tens of thousands of dollars are due this county and the townships of this county for unpaid taxes, and every device and subterfuge that cunning can suggest is resorted to to escape payment of taxes by non-resident, non-producing, non-enterprising taxpayers, who have stripped the county of its natural resources, leaving it naked and bare. Has this county no other interest to consult than one of mere partisanship? How is it with Iosco county? How is it with the other counties of the 2d judicial circuit? Prate not to us of non-partisanship. Our first duty is to the people, party and individual interests next." The same argument is good in regard to the candidates for circuit judge now in the field. Judge Simpson has always manifested a disposition to protect the interests of the masses of the people, regardless of all the influences brought to bear upon him. In this he has simply done his duty and done it honestly and fearlessly. The interests of the constituents have been faithfully served, and these same interests should be protected in the coming election.

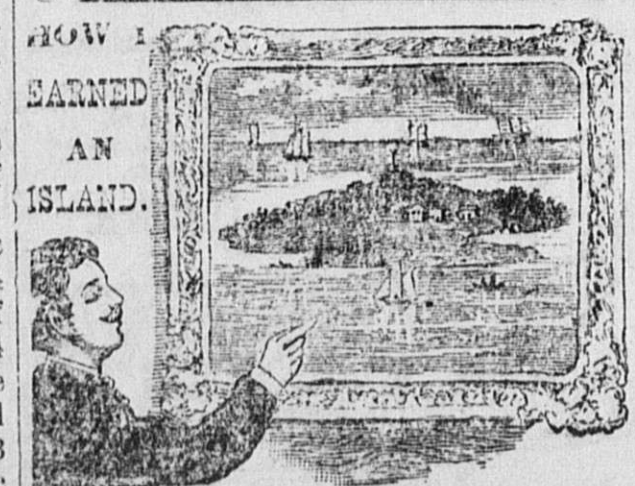
