## The Tim Plate Tariff

The announcement that a scheme is on foot to keep up the tariff on in plate though a practical fraud will surprise nobody．The histor of our tariff legislation in this coun－ try is full of just such devices；and
w．orse ones．When a tariff is adot－ w．orse ones．When a tariff is adot－
ted an attempt is made to persuade the country that it is for the genera public good；but it is no sooner adopted than those who have been instrumental in scuring it begin scheming tontwist it to their own
purpose－if it needs any twisting as is not always the case．The effor to secure such a decision as will hold all tin plate dipped in thís countr as a part of the domestic product in deciding．whether the tariff is to be contimued is，therefore，quite in keeping，with the customary course of tariff beneficapies．
In order to understand just what the scheme is，it is necessary to re
fer to the tariff act passed in fer to the tariff act passed in 1890
By schedule＂C＂of that act it provided that atter the 1st day of July，1891，tin plates，terne plates and taggers＇tin should pay a duty of two and twa－tenths cents per pound，and all manufactures of such tin plates，terne plates and taggers＇ tin should pay a duty of 55 per cent ad valorem．It was provided in the act，however，that on and after October 1，1997，tin plates and
terne plates lighter in weight terne plates lighter in weight than square feet shall be padmitted fred of duty，reen it be admitted free ppear to the sasf be made President（whe shall there of the proclamation make known the by that the aggregate quantity of such plates lighter than sixty－three pounds per hundred square feet pro auced in the United States during ither of the six years next proceed ing June 30 ，＇97 has equaled one－third he amount of such plates import ed and entered for consumption dur－ ing any fiscal year after the passage of the act and prior to Ostober 897.

The plan as now disclosed is to ave all tin plate dipped ir this country－the plates being imported －counted in，making up the one－ third of the importation necessary o prevent the abardonment of the aty．This does not seem to be at all the intent of the act，and it is sarcely to be believed that Secre－ pury Carlisle will so find it．The purpose and intent of the act were plate in this country，not the dip ing of imported plates，and the harmony with this purpose an full ent．The final prowiso of the para－ graph to which we have referred reads as follows：
And provided，forther，that the mount or weight of sheet iron or heet steel，manufactured wrought inte the manufacture articles or wares，tined or terne－ veight the United States with acturers or others．shall be consid－ ered as tin and terne plates produe eanine United States within the

There is nothing here about dip ping imported plates，and it does of the Treasury will strain the lan－ guage of the act to aid an interpre－ cation of it for the benefit of the monopolists．It is，however，of comparatively slight importance what the ruling of the，Secretary shall be in the matter．Before any ruling he can make will have any practical bearng－that is to say，
before the 30th of June，1897－there vill be a session of a Congress chosen xpressly to do away with the iniqui－ ties of the McKinley act．The ction of ithat Congress in the pre hises will not belikely to leave any hing for a Sercetary of the Treasury referred to．－Detroit Free Press．
