Mr. Humphrey has sold his farm, known as the Geo. Wismer place, to W. S. Hall, and purchased the farm and residence of Paul Goupil.

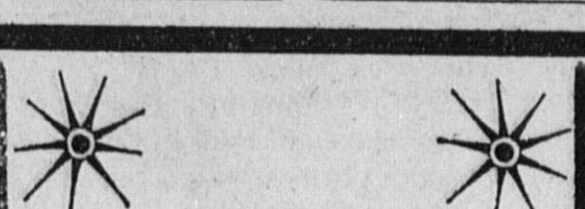

Uncle Sam, if he were not so wealthy, would soon bankrupt himself by some of his business methods. He sells timber land at \$2.50 an acre, purchasers generally being lumber companies who thus acquire a square mile of timber for about \$1,600. This value soon after the advent of a railroad, or if adjacent to good water facilities, increases to \$15,000 or \$20,000 in the hands of a new owners. Lumber barons are becoming more wealthy every year, while your Uncle Sam is fast becoming poor in forest resources. In 1885 the government of Bavaria sent an expert forester to study the timber lands of the United States, who stated that in less than thirty years this country would have to import timber, and, as American kinds would be preferred, recommended that Bavaria commenced to grow them as to the
