Demand for this land by homesteaders and under the timber and stone act has been less the past twelve months than in for mer years, but from the large amoun of land open for settlement in some of the counties, it would seem that there are still some desirable quarter sections to be had. The land office cannot give specific descriptions of any of this vacant land, but plats showing their exact location are furnished at \$1 per government township. Postmaster Toyatt expects shortly to receive a series of new money orders which are a great improvement over the old. The new order will come into general use after January of the coming year. The new order is a great saver of time inasmuch as it does away with the old white device or duplicate which used to be retained by the issuing office and mailed to the paying office. The elimination of this feature alone saves \$45,000 in envelopes, besides the extra time taken in sending the advice.

" This is signed by the receiver and serves as a receipt Formerly the advice was kept on fil and if the order did not come, notice was sent of the non-receiving. Or perhaps the postmaster as in the case, in smaller cities, did not send the advice, then the receiving postmaster could not enter the orders as paid simply retaining the canceled orders as cash.
