





### Mr. Hemans, The Man.

Lawton T. Hemans was born on Norember 4th, 1864, at Collamer, Onandago county, New York, where his father carried on the trade of a blacksmith. When Lawton was but 11 nonths old the family moved to Eaton Rapids, Michigan, and settled on a farm, but in 1868 they changed their abode to Mason, Ingham county, and his father took up his trade of blacksmith again. Six years later the family returned to rural life in the same county and there Lawton lived until he was 21 years of age. He graduated from the Eaton Rapids High School in 1884 and spent the following two years upon the farm, in school teaching and the study of law.



In 1888 he graduated from the law department of the University of Michigan and has practiced continually since, and from 1890 has been located in the city of Mason. In 1889 he was united in marriage to Minnie T. Hill, and they have one son, Charles T., 14 years of age. Few men have given of their time more lavishly and unselfishly for the good of state, and few have been better equipped with such purity of life, and which contributed to that end. He has been elected mayor of Mason five terms and has been a leading figure in the League of Michigan Municipalities, and organization designed to bring about scientific, effective and honest government for cities. Mr. Hemans has for many years been an earnest advocate of legislation extending to cities the greatest possible degree of home rule. He served in the legislature of 1900-1902 with distinction, and as a member of the Constitutional Convention he enjoved the confidence and esteem of men of all shades of political opinion. His idea in framing the constitution was that its basic and fundamental law should be framed without regard to the everchanging moods of political beliefs. Mr. Hemans is a member of the board of trustees of the Michigan State Historical Association, and for a number of years been a prominent figure in its deliberations.
