Member. <br> Another Big Traction Deal. <br> The reported passing of the Michigan United lines of trolley roads to the control of the Common Wealth Railway \& Light Co., adds another large system in this state to the Commonwealth concern. The latter company is made up of Hod-enpyl-Hardy \& Co., of New York, in which some Bay City and Saginaw people are interested, E. W. Clark \& Co., of Philadelphia, and W. A. Foote, of Jackson. These people control the Sag-naw-Bay City Railway Co., the Valley gas and electric lighting companies, and a number of other railway and lighting properties in the lower peninsula, including the AuSable river development. <br> The officers of the valley companies have been in Chicago during two or three days of the week. While confirmation has not been made as to the deal it is generally understood to be a fact. <br> The Michigan United operates interurban lines between Detroit and Kalamazoo, Detroit and Lansing, Jackson and Kalamazoo, Lansing and St. Johns, and Jackson and Grass Lake, and the acquisition includes other public utilities, electric, gas and power rights. <br> The deal is a most important one and places the Commonwealth practically in control of the public utilities and traction companies of the lower peninsula except those of the Detroit United, in Detroit and other localities, and the Saginaw \& Flint electric lines. <br> it is regarded as probable that the Commonwealth company will in the near future take over the electric line running from Flint to Saginaw, and the line being constructed between Saginaw and Bay City, on the east side of the river.-Bay City Tribune. |  |
