Carried by unanimous vote.

Thereupon chair declared the board at recess until 1:00 p. m.

Afternoon Session.

Board called to order at 1:00 p. m. Quorum present.

The special order of business set for this hour, viz.—Consideration of request of N. E. Michigan Development Bureau for an appropriation from Iosco County of \$250.00 called up by the chairman.

Moved by Robinson, supported by Dickinson that we appropriate \$250.00 to the N. E. Michigan Development Bureau.

Moved by Searle, supported by Nunn as an amendment that communication be laid on the table.

Amendment lost. Yeas—Anschutz, Burt, Minor, Nunn, Schroeder, Searle, Westervelt—7.

Nays—Belknap, Cowley, Culter, Dickinson, Grant, Phillips, Hall, Hartingh, Loffman, Myles, Robinson, Selee, Sullivan—13.

Vote was then taken on the original motion.

Nays—Anschutz, Burt, Minor, Nunn, Searle, Westervelt—6.

Thereupon on order of chair committees retired to their respective duties and balance of board were given a recess subject to call of chair.

Board called to order at 3:30 p. m. Tawas City, Mich., Oct. 15, 1915.

To the Hon. Board of Supervisors:

Gentlemen:—Your committee on finance and apportionment to whom was referred the amounts to be raised by taxation for state purposes, the amounts to be raised for soldier's relief purposes and the amounts to be raised for county road purposes report that they have had the same under consideration and recommend that the following amounts be raised by taxation upon the several tax rolls of the cities and townships of the county for the year 1915.

The sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) to be raised for Agricultural Society purposes.

The sum of Thirteen Thousand Five Hundred Eighty-One Dollars and Fifty-Six cents (\$13,581.56) to be raised for state purposes.

The sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) on each One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation of the county for the year 1914 be raised for county road purposes.

Your committee has also considered the resources and probable expenses of the county for the current year and estimate as follows:

Your committee respectfully recommends that the sum of Twenty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00) be raised by taxation and the amount be spread upon the tax rolls of the several townships and wards of the county of Iosco for the year 1915.

To the Hon. Board of Supervisors:

Your committee on county roads and bridges would respectfully submit the following as their report.

On Oct. 4, 1915, we met at McIvor to inspect the county roads. We found the stone road running north and south in fairly good condition. We found one mile of grading of last year's construction had been gravelled this summer at an expense of \$3,179.39 and in as good condition as could be expected for new work but the drainage is poor.

We then went to Hale and found both the roads and culverts in good condition. We also found one mile of new road running north of Whittemore in first class condition and the state has just finished an extra fine bridge up there.

In Reno we found the stone road running east and west in good shape but the Hemlock sand and clay road is quite badly cut up and in need of the road drag.

The Indian Lake road we found in fairly good condition.

What is known as the Wilber County road is in very bad shape with no attention paid to it at all. We request that the Honorable County Road Commissioners repair this road at once if possible to do so.

We found the Van Etnan Lake gravel road in an extra fine condition, we believe about the best in the county,

but the sand clay road up there is rough and in need of repair.

We also found the several amounts that have been expended on the different roads as follows:


