




HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Raw white potato laid on a soft cloth with potato next to the skin is very good as a remedy for burns. Mix gasoline and flour together to form a thick paste to clean garments. Rub this paste well into the material to be to be cleansed. Then hang the garment up to dry. After the gasoline has evaporated brush out the flour with a stiff clothes brush. Bread should not be wrapped in a cloth while still warm, as it is apt to become soggy and damp. Newly-baked bread should be allowed to cool, then should be put in a closed receptacle. If grease has spattered or food has been spilled on the stove, rub the stove im-mediately with crushed newspaper.
