Amendment to Constitution Required
to Enable Michigan to Receive
Federal Aid.
That Michigan's constitution does
not give the State Highway Commis
sioner authority to originate plans
for and to build roads as required by
the federal aid road bill, which offers
to Michigan $\$ 2,186,756$ during the
next five years, is the claim made by
the department of agriculture in a
recent letter to Governor Sleeper.
To remedy this defect and some
others affecting the Covert (assess-
ment district act and the sale of
bonds by townships, a joint resolution
has been unanimousl passed by both
houses of the legislature to submit
to the voters of Michigan at the
coming April election an amendment
to section 26, article 8 of the state
constitution.
The amendment makes but slight
changes, but remedies all the defects
mentioned. It is, therefore, very im-
portant to the road cause of Michigan
that this amendment to the constiu-
tion be made at this time.
