The Problem

Draw a continuous chain of circles across the face of the chart to the extreme right hand column of figures.

Begin at any number or figure in the extreme left hand column that you wish. Starting in this column you may go either up or down or to the right, but not to the left, until you reach the extreme right hand column.

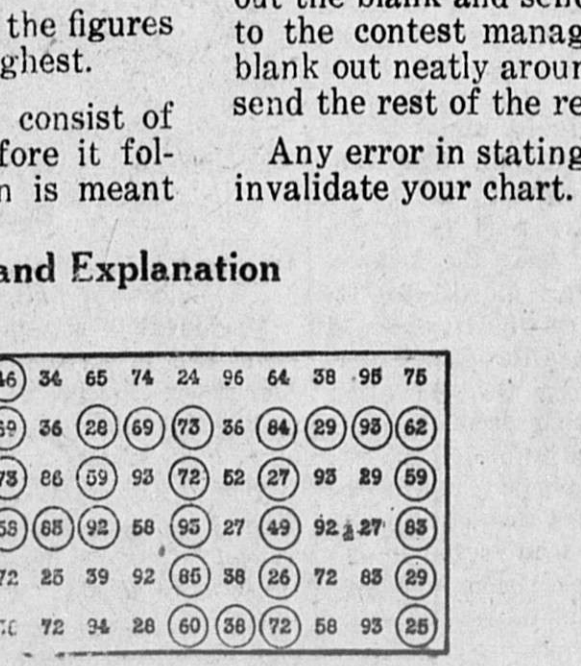
The problem consists of encircling the figures the sum total of which will be the highest.

Each section of the chain must consist of either three, four or five circles before it follows another direction. By section is meant

The Illustrative Chart and Explanation

The accompanying chart is shown to illustrate how the chain of circles may be drawn across the face of the puzzle chart. Starting in the upper left hand corner the first section contains four circles, the second section three, the third section three, the fourth section three, the fifth section five and so on.

The sum total of the figures in the circles is 1638. You may start off by having either three, four or five circles in the first column and end by having either three, four or five in the last.
