



How many times have you had a summer visitor stop you and ask directions for locating a specific street in Tawas City? Could you give that person a clearly defined answer.

In most cases the answer to the last question would be: "No, I never heard of that street!" Perhaps you did know the location, but your directions were so confusing, the visitor could not follow them.

For instance, recently one businessman gave directions to a visitor who wanted to locate a family residing on First Avenue. The reply was:

"Very simple-turn left at Brugger's corner, cross over the bridge and then make a right turn at the next cornerthat's First Avenue, I think."

Yes, these directions would be very simple for a local resident to follow, but to the visitor it was like trying to pin a tail on a donkey while blindfolded!

Now this all by way of leading to one large and important part of this editorial-this community is in great need of a new and comprehensive street marking system.

The present day street signs were erected quite a number of years ago and since that time many of the signs have disappeared from the posts, or are pointing in the wrong direction.

This writer urges the city, or even one of our civic-minded groups, to make a study of our present street marking system this fall and formulate a plan to prepare new street and intersection markers during the winter months.

It would be a very worthwhile project when completed and it would put an end to the present-day confusion on our back streets. Perhaps next spring when someone asks where Spruce Street is located, anyone could give clear-cut directions to find it.


