## Odd Fellows-Rebekaahs Hold Installation

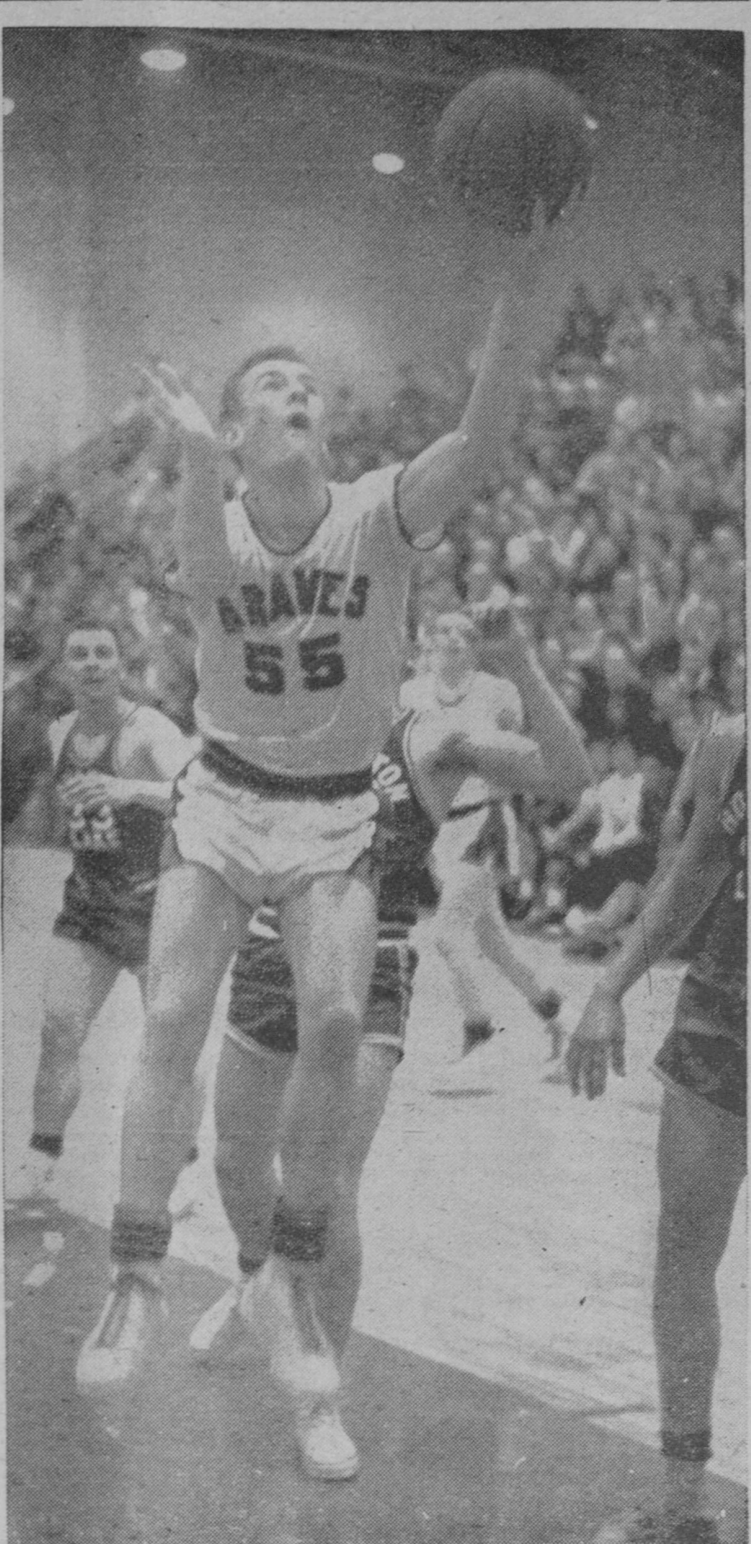

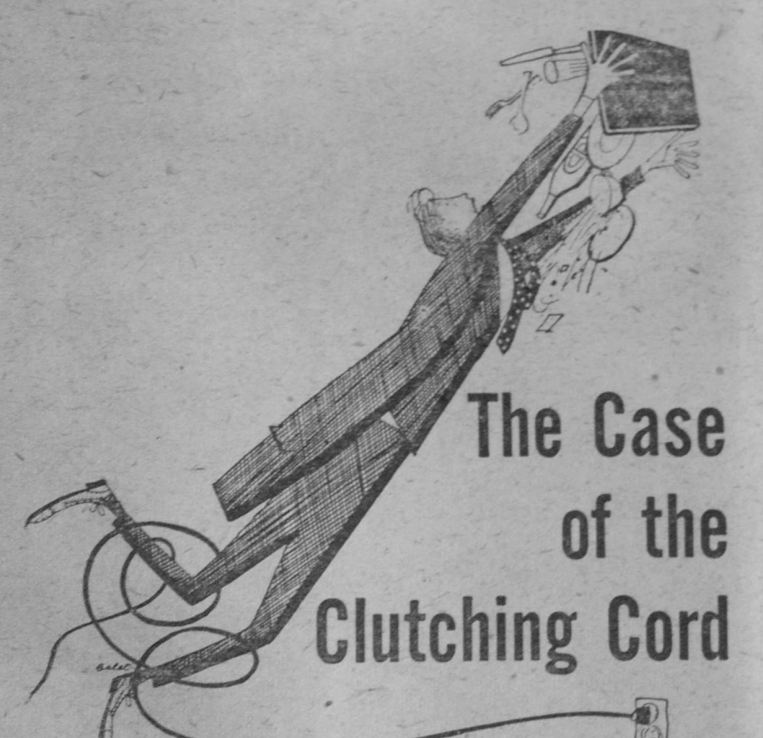

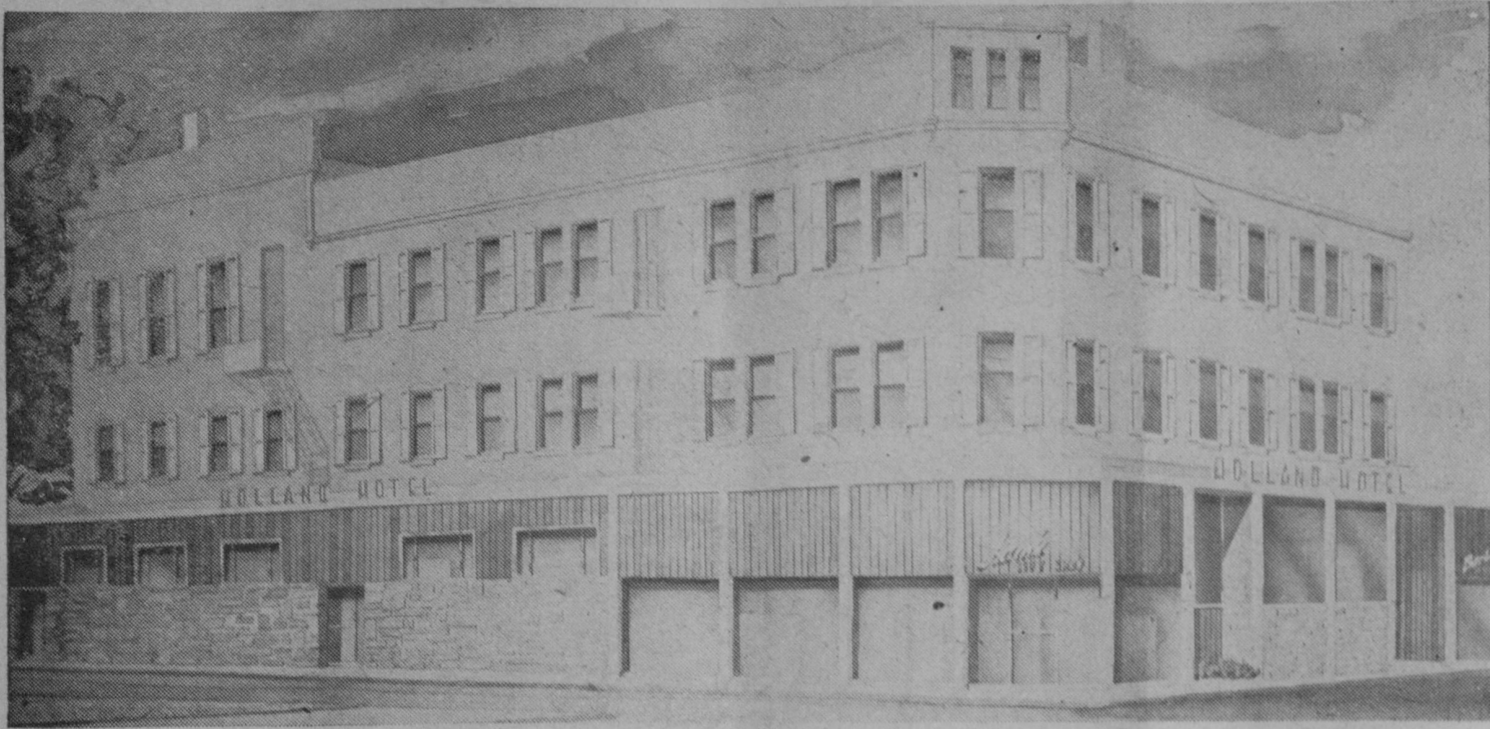

"Then in Justice Potter's concurring opinion on page 228-it is said: "If the title is in the state it holds it as a mere naked trustee subject to the right of access, to wharf and dock out, the right of bathing, the right to use, for domestic and agricultural purposes, the waters of the lake, and subject to all other rights of the riparian proprietor."

"We have had cases on both sides of the line. It has been held in the case of mortuaries, funeral parlors, and mental hospitals, that those are nuisances per se and cannot be erected in a residential area, (that is an interesting question here—whether this is a residential area—Judge Dehnke), even with assurances that they will be carefully operated with a definite purpose to eliminate all the annoyances possible to other property owners. "In other cases, injunctions were denied where the proposed development was a public park in one case, a fuel dock in another case, with smoke, and, as I mentioned awhile ago, the ship being so long that it extended in front of the property of other people; and an automobile garage, which I suppose we would now call a service station. "In those cases, the court held that temporary injunction, or an injunction at the end of the hearing, was not justified, that it was the obligation of the parties to wait and see what happened, and then ask for relief in case the operations were carried on in such a fashion as to constitute a serious annoyance and produce a serious destruction of property values." Judge Dehnke then adjourned the case for further hearing on February 18, for the purpose of taking testimony bearing upon the question of whether this operation would be a private nuisance per se. Hearing (Continued from Page 1.) a port for loading lake carriers with gypsum rock. The company's original intention was to construct an overhead tramway out to navigable water in Saginaw Bay, similar to United States Gypsum Company's installation at Alabaster. The company encountered engineering difficulties with this proposal and changed its plans to an earth-filled pier which was to have been built out from the shore line. A special bill was passed by both houses of the Michigan Legislature and signed by the governor directing the conservation department to convey title of the lake bottom to the company. However, the conservation department and the state attorney general contended that the act was illegal. National Gypsum Company then changed its plans to the present proposal, which includes an overhead gallery-type conveyor system leading to an off-shore pier.
