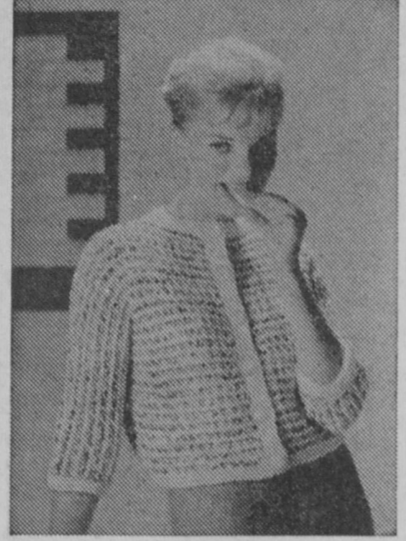

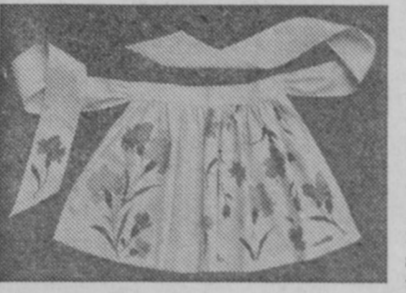
STYLISH SWEATER

PRETTY AND PRACTICAL

The apron we have for you today is an example of how simply a beginner can make something that is both pretty and practical. And if you claim to have all thumbs, then good. Because you could make this if you really had all thumbs. All you need is some material for the design, some bits of the same brightly colored material for the design, and some double faced Bondex. Then you just cut the design into shape and iron it on with the Bondex. The Bondex adheres on both sides—sticking the design to the apron. Easy, isn't it? Members whose terms are expiring are George Erickson of Burleigh Township and Henry Hasty of Whittemore.

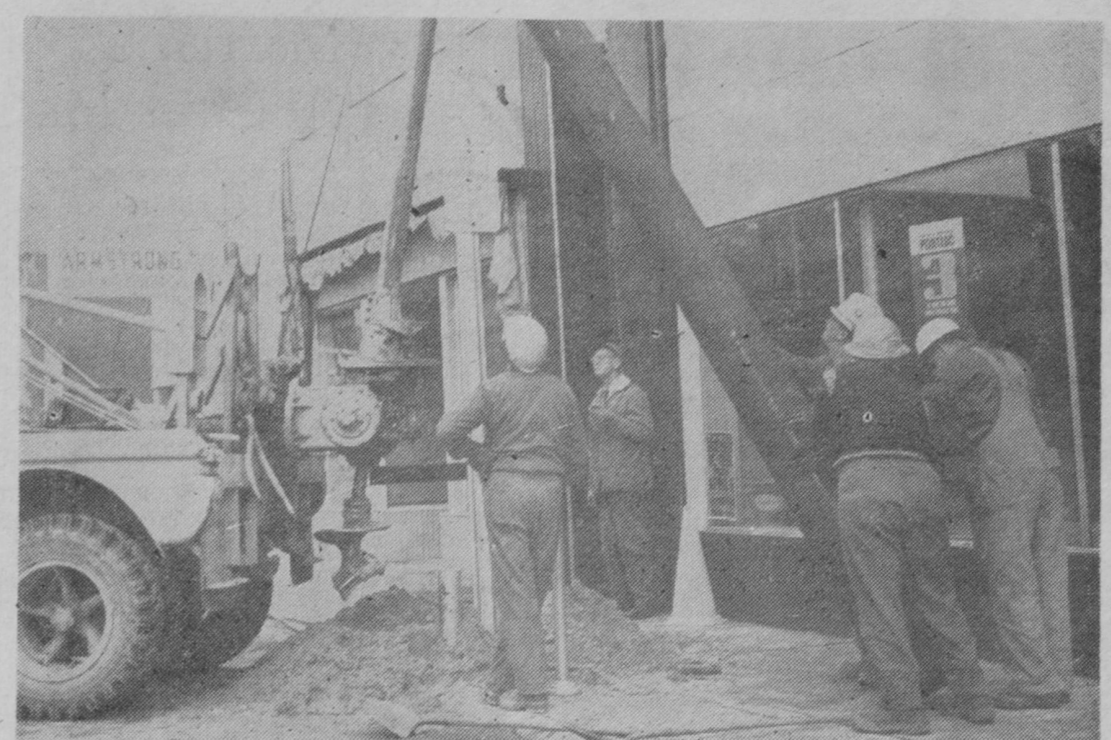
Terms of office on the board of education are for a period of four years, announces Supt. Ray Kesler.
