Yet here am I among you like a servant—Luke 22:27 (NEB)
During Jesus' last week, He instituted the Holy Communion for His disciples. Through it they were to remember Him and realize their oneness with Him and with one another.

Soon after the feast, the disciples began to quarrel among themselves over the question of status and position. Jesus patiently explained that true greatness lies in service. Although He was their Lord and Master, He Himself was among them as a servant.

When we follow Jesus, we cannot fail to influence the non-Christian. During his student days, a former Burmese Buddhist cabinet minister was impressed by the spirit of service of the Christian staff of a Christian college he attended.
