**Missionary to Speak Jan. 25 at Baptist Church**

Dr. Richard O. Pelham of the Congo, American Baptist missionary, will speak in the First Baptist Church, Tawas City, Sunday, January 25, 11:00 a. m.

Doctor Pelham is on furlough from his duties as chief of surgery and hospital director at Institute Medical Evangelique in Kimpese. The Pelhams began their first term as American Baptist missionaries in September of 1965 following a year's study period in Belgium. On arrival in the Congo, Doctor Pelham served as general physician for the 100-bed mission hospital at Sona Bata. In July of 1967, he assumed the surgical and administrative responsibilities at the hospital in Kimpese.

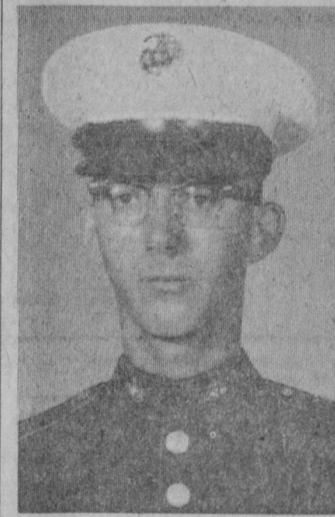
In 1963, Doctor Pelham was certified by the American Board of Surgery. He received his doctor of medicine degree at Temple University School of Medicine in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1958, and his bachelor of arts degree from Houghton College, Houghton, New York, in 1951.

Doctor Pelham was ordained to the gospel ministry in 1954 after completion of work taken at Nyack Missionary College. It was while studying at Nyack that Doctor Pelham became interested in medicine. Throughout the period of his schooling, he and Mrs. Pelham were in contact with the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society, their primary concern directed toward the needs in Congo.

Mrs. Pelham is the former Lucille Stroup of Muncy, Pennsylvania. The Pelhams were married in September 1947 and Mrs. Pelham also attended classes at Nyack Missionary College. She has been active in Congo in the area of women's work, particularly in teaching sewing classes.

While on furlough, the Pelhams are living in Flint. They are members of Shelton Heights Baptist Church there. Three of their four children are still at home: Patty, age 15; Rebecca, age 11, and Stephen, age six. The oldest daughter, Amy, is a recent graduate of the American School in Kinshasa, Congo, and entered Ottawa University in Ottawa, Kansas, as a freshman last fall.

Power Company to Grant Cabin Sites Consumers Power Company plans to grant 25 cabin site leases on the AuSable River and 25 site leases on the Manistee, in a coordinated program to extend recreational uses of the river.

The 25 AuSable River cabin sites are to be located over a nine-mile stretch of the river below Mio Dam. Each cabin site is to be limited to a specific location within a 10-acre section. Fencing is allowed only to protect the immediate cabin area and all health and zoning requirements must be observed.

Consumers Power Company has long played a major role in restoring and preserving Michigan's river lands. The company holds title to 704 miles of land fronting on four major rivers—the other two being the Pine and the Muskegon.

Over the past 40 years, the company has planted more than 22 million seedlings in areas where fire, drought and destructive lumbering practices by previous owners left the land scarred and useless. Good conservation thus has restored vast stretches of river lands and many of these areas are now open to the general public for recreation.
