In the Headlines...

- ➤ The millage renewal was passed for another ten year term allowing the District to continue to serve our community.
- ➤ The District purchased twenty-four staff and public-use computers to replace aging equipment at Headquarters and in the branches.
- ➤ A Branch Trek got patrons moving around to our eight branch libraries for fun and prizes. Patrons that were successful in visiting all eight branches were entered into a drawing for great prizes.
- ➤ The District purchased a new Ford Transit van to replace an aging delivery van. This van is used to pick up and deliver books and supplies to the eight branch libraries.
- ➤ All eight branch libraries resumed regular open hours after many months of closures or reduced hours due to COVID-19.

- ➤ There were 48,853 virtual visits to the District's website.
- ➤ Public Internet computers were used 9,611 times and there were 155,541 logins by patrons on their own laptops/devices using District provided WiFi.
- ➤ There were over 25,302 digital books, audiobooks, magazines, music and movies checked out using Overdrive and Hoopla.
- ➤ Branch library staff issued 1,430 new borrower cards in 2022.
- ➤ Headquarters staff added 8,567 new books, CD books and magazine subscriptions to the District collection, spending \$128,470.
- ➤ The District shared \$450,513 of the millage funds with local units of government to support branch library operations.
